Lunch Time Routines 12:00-1:00 pm

Students remaining at school for lunch will eat in their classrooms from 12:00– 12:20 pm. From 12:20–1:00pm, weather permitting, students are outside in the schoolyard. They are to remain on school property. For safety reasons, we ask that students not bring parent permissions forms requesting to visit local stores, restaurants or a classmate's home for lunch time. If your child's lunch time routine changes, a note signed by the parent/guardian will be required at that time and for each such occasion and sent to your child's teacher. Please come to the office and sign out your child(ren) when you pick them up. Phone Calls & Cell Phones: We would like to remind parents that students should use the school phone for emergencies or if they are not feeling well. Students should not be calling or texting home on their cell phones. Cell phones should be turned off and out of sight while on school property. Please refer to the Board Policy 318 "Personally Owned Electronic Devices" for further information.

Safety Awareness Week:

September 24th - September 28th, 2018 all YCDSB schools will participate in a variety of activities related to student safety, under an umbrella theme of "Safety Awareness Week".

Food & Birthday celebrations

As many of our students and some staff members have life threatening peanut allergies, we kindly ask that you refrain from bringing food items to school to share. This includes birthday celebrations, Tim Horton's, cakes, or treat bags at Halloween etc., that contain any food item. We appreciate your cooperation in keeping all of our community safe.

Parents & Visitors

It is important that all parents, friends and relatives report to the office upon entering the school, whether it is before, during or after school. We ask that all visitors "sign in" at the office. We appreciate your support and thank you for your co-operation.

Signing Out a Student: If you are picking up a child for an appointment during school hours, a parent/guardian must sign out the student in the office. The student will be buzzed to the office upon the parent arrival to the school. Please provide the school with a signed and dated note to this effect.

<u>Safety Reminders:</u>

Ensuring that we are providing a safe environment for all students both within, outside, and coming to and leaving from school is our shared responsibility. School staff will follow specific safety protocols to ensure your child's safety and we would ask that parents also adhere to the safety practices outlined below.

Parents who walk or drive their children to school are asked to say their good-byes before the children enter the school yard. In addition to fostering a sense of independence, this routine affirms the school's safety protocol that the only people in the school yard are the supervising teachers.

Parents of Kindergarten students are asked to bring their children directly to the Kindergarten yard between 8:45am and 9:00am.

-school doors are locked at 8:45 am, please come to the front doors and buzz for entrance with your child if you arrive after 9:00am, a late slip will be provided

-When dropping off or picking up your child at school, please use the designated parking area. The school parking lot is very busy, it is recommended that you use the church parking lot and walk your child(ren) to the school yard area.

Parent Parking: Visitor parking spaces are marked with appropriate signage and are for the general use of parents and / or other visitors to the school throughout the day. The number of 'visitor' parking spaces is limited. Please do not use 'visitor parking' to drop off/pick up your child. Parking is generally available at the Church and on side-streets. Please be a good neighbor and obey the road signs and times indicated.

Kiss N' Ride: On the east side (by the Church), there is staff parking and student drop-off area. SAFTEY FIRST—single lane of traffic only, stay to the right side. When students are dropped-off, they should proceed directly to the school yard. Do not pass other vehicles in the drop-off area as students exit vehicles. Patience and cooperation ensures student safety. There is NO PARKING in the Kiss N' Ride. Please do not use the visitor parking to drop your child off in the morning. This creates a dangerous situation and impedes the flow of traffic in the Kiss N' Ride area. If you plan to walk your child to the school yard, please park at the Church or on a side-street and walk to the school along the sidewalk.

Bus Loop Shared with German Mills P.S.: We share a one-way bus loop with our neighbouring school German Mills P.S. The Bus Loop is for German Mills staff (parking), German Mills student drop-off, and school buses for both our schools. **Please do not drive/park in the BUS LOOP area before or after school**.

Morning Supervision and Dismissal:

School yard supervision begins each morning at **8:45am** in the school yard. Unless students are registered in the *Before and After Program*, they **MUST NOT be dropped-off early**, as there is no teacher supervision. Students are dismissed at 3:30pm, and should depart from the school grounds promptly and follow their pre-arranged after-school routine (B & A Program, bus, walk home, parent pick up, etc.,) If a student is not picked up at 3:30, he/she should come directly to the office.

Your child's safety and that of all of our students depends on everyone's cooperation. Thank you for your support.

Effective Use of Our Resources

Bus Safety Reminders:

* Parents should understand the need to make alternative arrangements for their child/children if the school bus is late.

* Parents should arrive at the bus stop 5 minutes prior to the regularly scheduled pick-up and drop-off times (10 minutes during the first week of school).

- * Parents should know their child/children's route number.
- * Parents should know their child/children's bus stop location.
- * Parents should know the school and bus company phone number in the event of an emergency.
- * Ensure use of Safe Rider Sticker System for all JK, SK and Gr 1 students.

Parents are reminded to refer to the Late Bus Report on the Student Transportation Services website at <u>www.schoolbuscity.com</u> prior to leaving for the bus stop in the mornings and afternoons.

Administration of Medication: If your child requires prescription/non-prescription medication, check with your doctor about the possibility of prescribing medication that could be taken before school and/or after your child returns home. If your child is required to take medication at school, it is the YCDSB's policy that parents submit a completed Administration of Medication Form to the school with the medication. Do not send medication to school without notifying the school and completing the form. Medication is kept at the office. (Policy 207A 207B)

Emergency Contact Forms

Please take the time to ensure that the information on the Emergency Contact form is accurate and current. With the beginning of a new school year, there is a lot of student data that requires inputting into our system to ensure the safety of all of our students. Your support is greatly appreciated! Please return all forms by Friday Sept. 7th, 2018.

Buddy Bench

Thank you to the **Catholic School Council** for supporting the purchase of a Buddy Bench for our school.

Recently installed in our yard the Buddy Bench is a place to go if you have no one to play with or if you need some quiet time. If you see someone on the Buddy Bench...

- -ask them to play
- -ask them to walk and talk
- -speak with the person sitting with you

The Buddy Bench fosters friendships, radiates kindness and inclusion and encourages our students to learn about helping one another. The Buddy Bench helps to build empathy, reinforce inclusiveness, and acts as a constant reminder to everyone to be kind to one another.

Effective Use of Our Resources

Pediculosis (Head Lice) Policy 210

The York Catholic District School Board recognizes concerns related to pediculosis (head lice) at the school and community level. Pediculosis (head lice) are not a public hazard, as they do not cause illness, but they are a nuisance. To prevent pediculosis (head lice) from becoming a problem at our school we all need to work together. Please check your child's head on a regular basis for lice or nits. If you do find lice or nits, you must contact the office so that we can notify other parents in your child's class to keep a special watch for any signs of head lice.

A student's readmission to school is contingent upon the Parent/Guardian submitting a completed and signed "Pediculosis Treatment Form" communicating to the Principal that treatment for pediculosis (head lice) has been administered.

More information on the identification, treatment and prevention of pediculosis (head lice) from the Canadian Pediatric Society (<u>http://www.caringforkids.cps.ca/handouts/headlice</u>) and Toronto Public Health (toronto.ca/health) is available on the school's website. A hard copy of the information posted on the school's website will be provided by the Principal if requested by the Parent/Guardian.

School Communication to parents related to Policy 206: Protection of Students with Asthma

In accordance with the *Act to Protect Pupils with Asthma* (Ryan's Law : Ensuring Asthma Friendly Schools, 2015) the Board approved a new policy *# 206: Protection of Students with Asthma* at its June 21st Board Meeting. The York Catholic District School Board recognizes that there are some students within the school system who have a diagnosis of asthma which could be life threatening. The York Catholic District School Board also recognizes that asthma management is a shared responsibility among students, parents, caregivers and the entire school community.

It is the responsibility of parent(s)/guardian(s) to advise the school immediately upon registration and/or when in receipt of a diagnosis of asthma. It is also the responsibility of parent(s)/guardian(s) to ensure that all medical information pertinent to their child's diagnosis of asthma is always current.

If your child has a diagnosis of asthma please contact the school office immediately so that the appropriate forms are completed and school records are up to date in accordance with Policy 206.

Thank you for your immediate attention to this request and your ongoing support in the shared responsibility for asthma management in our school. Please refer to the Board's website for more information related to Policy 206.

The Protection of Anaphylactic Students Policy 209: The York Catholic District School Board has a comprehensive policy for students with life threatening allergies. As outlined in the policy, parents are asked to inform the school of such allergies immediately and are required to fill in specific forms with yearly updated photos, which are available in the office. Parents are required to provide the school with two (2) up-to-date, single-dose applications of Epinephrine auto-injector. We ask that NO PRODUCTS be brought into the school that may contain nut products such as peanut butter, certain types of candy bars, cookies, etc. Please be sure to read all label ingredients. Fresh vegetables, fruit, 'no nut' granola bars, raisins, etc., make great snacks for your child(ren). Thank you for your cooperation.

Allergy Awareness

All York Catholic District School Board schools are nut and peanut products safe because we have students/staff with a potentially life-threatening form of allergic reaction called anaphylaxis. The York Catholic District School Board recognizes that anaphylaxis management is a shared responsibility among allergic students, parents, caregivers and the entire school.

In accordance with Board Policy 209, Protection of Students with Anaphylaxis, it is the policy of the York Catholic District School Board that all students be entitled to safe and healthy environment in our schools. This includes:

- Establishing an allergy safe school via the restriction of specific foods and food products that may contain nuts, tree nuts, or other allergens
- Implementing 'no food sharing' rules
- Emphasizing proper hand washing routines

We have put strategies and practices into place to reduce the risk of anaphylaxis among our students, and we continue to review our safety practices related to anaphylaxis awareness.

Thank you for everything you do to help keep our school a healthy and safe environment for all students and staff.

Junior Band: Boys: long-sleeved white dress shirt, navy blue knitted crested cardigan, navy blue dress pants (trutex with pleat, not the cotton ones), solid navy blue socks and black dress shoes (no sport shoes).

Girls: long-sleeved white blouse/shirt with a collar, navy blue school kilt, navy blue knitted crested cardigan, navy blue tights and black dress shoes (no sport shoes).

Intermediate Band: Boys: long-sleeved white dress shirt, navy blue knitted crested cardigan, navy blue dress pants (trutex with pleat, not the cotton ones), solid navy blue socks and black dress shoes (no sport shoes).
